- John Dennis (JAD) took the chair and welcomed everyone to the meeting. He also registered thanks to the staff at Keighley Leisure Centre for allowing *sportKeighley* to use the facilities.
- The meeting also acknowledged the apologies of Ann Cryer MP whose husband John has lost his fight with cancer. Ann is a great supporter of *sportKeighley* and the thoughts of the attendees and all the partners are with Ann at this difficult time.

- The meeting started unconventionally with a demonstration by Andy Wattmuff of the “Try Golf” activity, designed to introduce youngsters to the game. Attendees were invited to chip and putt at special targets set up in Victoria Hall and it is fair to say that it is not just children who need some advice on technique!! Andy explained the availability of the system for schools and community groups, and some of the development pathways that can lead to local driving ranges, open courses and golf clubs. Local golf clubs are actively encouraging junior members and there are many fine local players in the district. Andy has been working with the Positive Futures initiative and commented on how the putting exercise in particular produced high concentration levels in otherwise inattentive youngsters. 2. Summary of the last meeting

- Most people had received notes from the last meeting in September. Copies are available on request or via the *sportKeighley* website www.sportkeighley.com.
- Malcolm Longsdon has pointed out that he is not the lead on the Young Peoples Fund / Partnership as mentioned in the previous notes (see section 9 for an update on this funding).

3. New Meeting / Web Format

- JAD described the new format to be adopted for meetings. It had been felt when preparing the notes of previous meetings that the previous format led to a rather random dissemination of information. Therefore, meeting agendas will now follow the topics contained in the *sportKeighley* Physical Activity Action Plan (PAAP) as follows: Information (including partner updates); Facilities; Transport Infrastructure; Activities and Coaching; Clubs; Funding and Regeneration.
- The website will also be simplified to follow the same structure and a draft update is appended to these notes. This was after feedback that the site can be difficult to navigate.

4. Information

4.1 *sportKommunity*

- Tariq Ahmed introduced himself from the Asian Disability Network, based at Key House in North Street in Keighley since moving from Bradford last July. He emphasised that the name is somewhat misleading (and will soon change) as the organisation is keen and available to assist and work with all people with disabilities. Work covers a wide range, including visits to schools, parent help, behaviour management and holiday activity provision. The organisation is carrying out a mapping exercise across Keighley and is keen to work with partners, particularly in terms of opportunities for sport and physical activity.
- JAD recently had a meeting with David Gent, Regional Director of Sport England. This had been very positive, and David was shown the draft physical activity maps and talked through the proposed changes to the website. He recommended inviting the Sports Minister, Richard Caborn MP, for an update visit to Keighley and to continue to develop the structure and format described.

4.2 *sportsKools*

- Kay Lindley reported that Victoria Primary's Friday Enrichment afternoons are now up and running and that a variety of activities are available but more are always welcome. Facilities at the school are also available to clubs and community groups. Kay can be contacted on 01535 210110.
- Chris Evans reported that the headteacher from a highly successful primary school, St Leonard's in Padiham in Lancashire (referred to in the previous notes) will be speaking to primary heads at Education Bradford in the near future. Many attendees who are not headteachers are interested in attending.

4.3 *sportKollege*

- Danny Crabtree reported that funding to take selected students on a skiing trip had been found and that this would be a pilot that would then be opened up more widely.
- Keighley College students have recently come second in the International Space Olympics held in Russia. An excellent performance!
- Keighley College mixed team recently came second (only to professional draymen) in a Timothy Taylor-sponsored Beer Dray Pull in aid of Sue Ryder Care at Manorlands in Oxenhope!!

4.4 **sportKouncil**

- Mark Gladwin gave an introduction to and brief summary of the recently-launched Bradford Play Strategy.
- The strategy is called “All to Play For” and is backed up by research data in a document entitled “Playback 2002”. The document has been prepared by Mark Gladwin and Tina Lafferty of Bradford Council’s Early Years and Childcare Unit (Tina has now moved on).
- The strategy is based on the assumption that children have a right to play. Recent research has shown that children use at least as much energy playing as they do in more formal sports and activities and both are very important. The data (based on responses by children and their parents) reveals four key basic requirements for play to be facilitated:
 - Greater tolerance of play activities, especially near to housing;
 - Safer and cleaner neighbourhoods for play;
 - Better, safer parks and playgrounds;
 - Availability of suitable adults to facilitate but *not* take control.
- The strategy is a framework document; a vision, and does not seek to “tell people how to play”. Nor does it carry with it specific funding or have a specific action plan. The key action to arise will be the development of the Bradford Play Partnership where a variety of organisations will be asked to look at their individual strategies and assess how these have a bearing on opportunities for children’s play.
- There will also be specific detailed research on opportunities for play in one ward in each Bradford constituency, including Keighley. It is possible that the Keighley ward selected will be an urban one, but no decision has yet been made. Any thoughts and feedback on this should be given to Mark Gladwin on 01274 432044. There will be co-ordination with *sportKeighley* on this study.
- Copies of the reports were available at the meeting, and further copies can be obtained from Mark on 01274 432044. Danny Crabtree suggested that Keighley may like to have an event next year on National Play Day which is the first Wednesday in August.
- Cllr Allan Rhodes reported on the Town Planning exercise which is being carried out by Elaine Applebee on behalf of Keighley Town Council. All councillors have been asked to carry out audits in their wards and are reporting back this week. Any input to this process should be via the Town Clerk, Mrs Bailey on 01535 618252. This will complement and use the mapping exercise currently been undertaken by KADRA (plus other mapping exercises) and co-ordinate with Town Centre Plans and the Airedale Masterplan.
- John Coulton reported that Bradford is piloting in West Yorkshire a national scheme called “LeisureWatch”, designed to increase child protection in sports and leisure centres. Sites, including those in Keighley, will be kite-marked as part of the scheme once staff have been trained. Training will enable staff to detect potential problem clients and activate a customer care-type challenge approach. There are also links with the police and the probation service. Training will be given in November/December with the scheme going live early in 2005. The training is available for non-Council staff at a relatively low cost although there needs to be a nominated scheme co-ordinator at each facility. This was welcomed by the meeting.

4.5 **sportKare**

- The PCT physical activity database, which will form an integral part of the new *sportKeighley* web structure, is being finalised. All partners are requested to provide details of their physical activity sessions to feed into the database.
- Simon Rowlands, Physical Activity Development Coordinator from Bradford District Health Development Partnerships has forwarded the following two messages – please feedback if possible: *I am trying to gather together the results of any physical activity mapping exercises undertaken by health workers in Bradford and Airedale. I am hoping this will help to inform future mapping by allowing us to see what kind of information has been collected in the past, as well as avoiding any repetition. If you are aware of, or have undertaken some form of PA mapping I would be very grateful if you could either let me have the contact details of the lead worker, or send any finished reports to me at Leeds Road Hospital, Maudsley Street, Bradford BD3 9LH.*

A regular health section has been negotiated with the T & A. To launch this an initial health supplement will be put together..... To do this we need your help. We need a continuous trickle of positive/good news/people centred stories that we can include in the supplement and for the regular health section. It is a fantastic opportunity to promote all the good work happening across the District around health. I

need this information as soon as possible so if you could think of some examples of projects/initiatives (there must be 100s of examples!) or if you could forward me details of people, groups, projects I should contact, it would be really helpful. I need this information as soon as possible.

4.6 sportKlubs

- There has been since the last sportKeighley meeting a meeting with Malcolm Longsdon to discuss the list of proposed activities for club-school links developed after feedback from many clubs as a result of the successful Oakbank Sports College “Club Links” event in March. Unfortunately the immediate underspend monies that had been available for this sort of activity has now been taken up, but there will be immediate opportunities for the initiatives to be developed and funding will be available from a variety of sources (see section 9 below). In the meantime some of the initiatives can at least move forward by co-operative effort and lateral thinking and there are many examples of this. In addition, some of the projects that have gained funding in the area create opportunities for other clubs to be involved and there may be opportunities here too.
- Tremendous progress has been made in the opening of Greenhead School for wider club use and an update sent out to members of Keighley & Craven Athletic Club and other users on this is attached. Please note the wide range of facilities in the City Learning Centre which will now be open on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. The aim is to guarantee opening of the community wing of the school via the City Learning Centre and by increasing the number of activities reduce the unit rate for usage to make the facilities much more affordable. Keighley & Craven Athletic Club has been leading on this, with tremendous help from Tricia McCarthy and David Copeland at Greenhead, Bradford Council Sport & Leisure and Malcolm Longsdon at Bradford Education. Jayne Rawnsley is employed at the CLC and she will be involved with reception facilities and also IT training if required. The CLC can be contacted on 01535 210500 or at info@clcgreenhead.net .

4.7 sportKorporate

- Keighley & District Regeneration Alliance (KADRA) is moving forward with the proposed mapping exercise of Keighley’s facilities and activities, which will include sporting facilities. This will help to assess a baseline against which future participation can be measured.
- JAD has been invited to a discussion of the Airedale Masterplan later in November and will be feeding in information from the many initiatives described in these notes.

5. Facilities Development

- The investment in facilities in the Keighley District is currently quite extraordinary. The following schemes represent multi-million pound projects to which should be added the recent £1M refurbishment of Marley, the opening of the Highfield Community Centre and Multi-Activity Community Areas (MACAs) at Steeton, Silsden and Holycroft. It is intended that all facilities are entered into the developing Sport England “Active Places” database (www.activeplaces.com) and this will form a key link on the facilities page on the sportKeighley website.

5.1 Holy Family School

- Tender documents are being prepared for the new NOF-funded Sports Hall, with a realistic commencement date for construction of October 2005. Construction work is already underway at the school redeveloping the front area. This is effectively Year 0 of the facility development plan and Tim Garthwaite has met with JAD and Hannah Lindsey to discuss initial management details for the facility which is designed to be widely available to the community via sportKeighley and Airedale Primary Care Trust.

5.2 Parkside School, Cullingworth

- JAD had met with the headteacher and staff at Parkside to discuss the “Building Schools for the Future” (BSF)-funded work that is due to commence next summer. The new development will include extensive arts and sports facilities which will be accessible by the community. There may be particular opportunities for the development of netball and hockey at the site among other activities.

5.3 Utley

- Danny Crabtree reported that positive discussions are ongoing between rugby league and rugby union and the College at the Utley site in order to ensure maximum usage of facilities. This will include the Cricket Club on the site who won promotion last year. A new access is being planned and there is a

meeting on 15th November to discuss the potential use of College construction students and apprentices in helping to design and build a new clubhouse as part of their training.

5.4 Keighley College

- Danny reported that the final plans are being drawn up this month for the new College building on Dalton Lane. This will include a new “Space Centre” on the corner with Bradford Road and also specialised sports science testing laboratory. The emphasis will be on the science and technology aspects of these and other areas, and the laboratory will link in with the proposed co-ordination of Keighley Coaches and physical activity leaders and increased coaching qualification opportunities through courses run at the College and throughout Keighley. Although the College HQ will not have extensive sports facilities itself, College sport will increase through the use primarily of Marley but also other facilities throughout the town. The facility will also include conference facilities which will essentially be used for the training of Leisure Management Students and will include a mock-up Timothy Taylors pub! The aim is to open the new College in September 2007.

5.5 Greenhead

- JAD reported on a meeting held on Tuesday 2nd November between key partners associated with the development of Greenhead. The school, Keighley & Craven Athletic Club, UK Athletics, Bradford Education Client Team and others are pulling together a development plan that will hopefully result in the shared vision of a generic physical fitness development centre involving athletics and gymnastics amongst other activities. There are also plans for a full range of activities and facilities for the disabled to be integrated as part of the redevelopment of Greenhead School and also the Keighley Special Schools on the site. The target is to have a new school on the site by September 2007. The process is not easy and Greenhead will be something of a pilot project in terms of the development of the track and its relationship to extended schools and BSF programmes.

5.6 Bronte School Site

- JAD reported discussions from the new Oakworth Urban Village project which has the former Bronte School site high on its agenda. The site is still extensively used (by Oakworth Juniors FC and Sport Camps Ltd among others) and there is interest in its acquisition by a number of partners including the PCT. Discussions will now take place and a feasibility study will be prepared to assess the best way forward. Cllr Allan Rhodes confirmed that to the best of his knowledge there are no firm plans for the site at present.

5.7 SKate Project Accommodation

- Mary Beanland gave an update on the search for a suitable site for indoor skateboarding and extreme sports facilities in the town. There are a number of possibilities that are currently being explored. There will be a launch meeting for the SKate project on Wednesday 15th December between 4 and 6.30pm at Keighley Youth Services Centre on Parkwood Street. This is open to everyone of all ages who are interested in promoting this idea. There is much support from the partnership and local contacts. JAD reported that Cllr Ian Shackleton has gained funding for an outdoor facility at Cross Roads and he had passed on literature from a recent relevant seminar held in Leeds. JAD has been talking to local primary schools about the possible use of playgrounds as starter or feeder facilities for a main indoor facility. Chris Evans offered help in making contacts with facility operators and equipment designers. Cllr Allan Rhodes stated that monies from planning Section 106 agreements has been earmarked in Keighley for such a facility.

5.8 Keighley Leisure Centre

- Andy Bailey and John Coulton described plans to redevelop part of the Leisure Centre including the moving of the Tone Zone to the upper level near to the café. Executive approval is expected in November and the work is planned for February 2005.
- There will also be a new access to the swimming pool to allow for better disabled access in the near future.

5.9 Guardhouse Primary School MACA

- Darren Starkey reported that this new facility should be open by January 2005.

5.10 Oakbank

- It is hoped that an early start can be made on converting the south-east corner of the site into a cycling facility, even if it consists of a bunded earth circuit at first. This should gain impetus from the CyKle event on 17th November (see section 6.2 below).

6. Transport Infrastructure

6.1 Walkways

- JAD reported the successful launch of the Walkways network during Autumn Walking week on October 6th. Over 150 people of all ages and backgrounds took part in separate walks on the four routes, meeting the Mayor at Keighley College for a healthy buffet afterwards. Work is now underway, sponsored by Bradford Environment Partnership Funding, to produce leaflets and information on the four routes and to waymark them. The idea is to create safe, pleasant walking routes between key parts of the town so that people have a choice as to how they access various facilities and activities, whether sport-related or not.
- There will also be a programme of renovation developed that will be assisted by Keighley College to see where trainees and apprentices can apply their developing skills to maintenance and upkeep of the routes.
- Kay Lindley reported that Victoria School, as well as participating in the Walkways launch, had had a successful walking event on the previous day when parents and children had walked to school and home again. Traffic around the school was considerably reduced! Both this and the Walkways launch received good coverage in the Keighley News, and JAD did radio interviews for Bradford Community Broadcasting and the Pulse.
- The value of raising awareness about the routes is already being shown. JAD has been contacted by the developers of Dalton Mills with a view to potentially increasing the length of riverside path on Walkway 4, and planners have indicated that a suitable diversion of the Worth Way along the river would be required in any redevelopment of Quinlan's Mill on Walkway 1. There is also a planning application in at the former Wask site which includes provision for a footpath/cycleway along the route of the proposed Keighley-Oxenhope Cycleway.
- Work on Safe Routes to School and walking routes is ongoing, and these will eventually link into the Walkways network.

6.2 CyKle

- The meeting was reminded of the CyKle Launch event due to be held at Oakbank School on Wednesday 17th November at 7pm. Access is via the main school entrance off Oakworth Road although entrance to the building will be via the Sports Centre Entrance opposite the Astro turf pitch. The event will be held in the assembly hall. There will be space for bikes and demonstration machines as well as displays and posters.
- A draft plan of proposed cycle routes across Keighley has been produced and a diverse audience has already committed to attending. This has initially focused on creating routes across the town and also linking schools with the National Cycle Network (Leeds-Liverpool Canal) and creating routes for children to cycle to school.
- The Keighley News has already done a piece promoting the event, which is aimed at building links between the diverse cycling community and improving opportunities for cycling in the district. It is hoped that next year's *sportKarnival* will take the form of a Festival of Cycling to coincide with national Cycling Week in June.

6.3 AKtiveHoppa

- JAD reported that he had met with Keighley & District Travel and the suggestion had been made to possibly include the AKtiveHoppa proposals in K&D's bid to West Yorkshire Metro to run Yellow School Buses. The core use of the buses is for the school trip, but they are available at other times for services such as this. JAD will update partners at the next meeting in January.

6.4 West Yorkshire Metro Route Planner

- Attention was drawn to the excellent and newly-revised Journey Planner via www.wymetro.com.

- Select “Journey Planner” and you will be connected to the Yorkshire Traveline site. Select “Journey Planner” again, enter your starting point (eg, postcode) in the “From” section and your destination in the “To” section. Not only will you get bus and/or train times and numbers but also maps of the nearest bus stop and the time to set off walking to the stop/station!! Furthermore, all required walking distances are given in metres!!
- It is intended that this site will form a key link on the Access page of the *sportKeighley* website.

7. Activities

7.1 Snooker

- Stuart Rawnsley described his role as organiser of the Crosshills and District Snooker League. The league has been running since the 1940's and the client base is adult male. Matches are played on Thursday evenings throughout the winter and twenty-eight teams compete in two leagues. There are sixteen different clubs playing stretching from Oxenhope to Silsden. There are also competitions for teams and individuals. Details are on the website at www.freewebs.com/crosshillssnookerleague . The league is seeking sponsorship so any help in this respect would be most welcome, and Stuart can be contacted at diceman1@btopenworld.com .
- Stuart also spoke about the enthusiasm for snooker amongst younger players, boys and girls, but the barriers to play that exist because most tables are located at private members clubs and licensed premises that restrict access for under -18s and even under- 21s. Even where access is available the cost is often prohibitive. It was agreed by the meeting that some options to address this problem need to be produced and in the first instance Stuart will attend the SKate launch on 15th December to see what opportunities may arise from that.

7.2 Gyms and Weight Training

- There was some discussion about opportunities for young people involving access to gyms and weights, including disabled youngsters. There is a wide range of provision in Keighley for various niches in the general “keep-fit” market, but it was pointed out that youngsters are often restricted. Danny Crabtree pointed out that there has to be some caution in youngsters using various pieces of equipment, especially free weights.
- Hannah Lindsey mentioned the flexibility of some of the private gyms in this respect and also the gym at Oakbank Recreation Centre which makes provision for younger people.

7.2 Activity Database

- As mentioned in section 4.5 above the Airedale PCT Activities Database is ready to receive details of activities going on in the district. Please make a note of all activities and email to Rachael.Wood@bradford.nhs.uk .
- This link will form a key link on the revamped *sportKeighley* website, and it is important for it to be of use that people update Rachael on any changes or new activities.

8. Coaching

- There is an extensive amount of coaching going on at local clubs and schools on a voluntary basis and under the NOF Out of School Hours Programme. The new “Step into Sport” programme will also increase opportunities for coaches.
- The Keighley Community Coach, Richard Taylor (absent from the meeting because he was coaching!!) is visiting all of the schools in the area and continuing to deliver coaching to many groups. The post has been a tremendous success and is a credit to Richard and the various funders who have helped to make it possible
- There are a number of coaching opportunities in the form of Community Coach jobs and coach training courses in the district and in West Yorkshire in general. 9. Funding

9.1 b-Funded

- This is a central website produced by Bradford Council to provide guidance on all types of funding. It can be found at www.bfunded.org.uk. This site will provide a key link on the revamped *sportKeighley* website. Other key funders such as Sport England, Football Foundation and NOF are also shown as links on the website.

9.2 Young Peoples Fund

- A meeting was held in October involving many *sportKeighley* partners and chaired by Malcolm Longsdon of Bradford Education to explore the possibility of a significant bid (£1M) from Keighley to the new Young Peoples Fund. The funding cannot go to schools or to local authorities or other statutory organisations, and the meeting discussed suitable potential *sportKeighley* partners and how all sectors could benefit from such funding.
- Subsequent to the meeting, further guidance on this level of funding suggested that projects should involve three or more regions of the UK. The involvement of Bradford Education and similar authorities would therefore be likely to be less on this particular funding stream, although smaller bids are possible and will be subject to further discussion.
- JAD has therefore explored the possibility of working with other areas in the country where a similar situation to that of Keighley is being experienced in order to apply for the larger amount but also to establish links whereby experiences can be shared. There are three other such places where links are already established: Leigh and Swinton in Greater Manchester and Lewes in East Sussex. Keighley is to Bradford what Leigh is to Wigan, Swinton is to Salford and Lewes is to Brighton. Leigh is on the verge of exciting times in sport through the development of the Leigh Sports Village (www.leighsportsvillage.co.uk). Swinton has some very run-down facilities and wishes to learn from others in order to improve things. There has been a tremendous amount of work done in Lewes to improve facilities and communication in sport and physical activity. However, there are some common threads and particularly some common barriers to wider participation of young people in physical exercise, and it is these that the initiative, called "Standing on the Shoulders of Giants" aims to jointly tackle. Initial thoughts and details are attached, and any ideas and suggestions are welcome.

10. Any Other Business

- The meeting ran rather late and thus there was no time for any further issues to be discussed at the meeting.
- In the notes of the previous meeting in September there had been a number of "Key Activities" identified as priorities under the PAAP. These are listed below: the ones in red are still to be actively taken forward, the ones in blue have made significant progress.
 - **Key Activity – Development of Local Coaching and Activity Pathways.**
 - **Key Activity – Summer Activities Planning for 2005.**
 - **Key Activity – Walking Week and WalkWays launch in October.**
 - **Key Activity – SKate project development.**
 - **Key Activity: Promote School Health Clubs, WalkWays, CyKle, AKtiveHoppa and Skate initiatives.**
