- John Dennis (JAD) took the chair and welcomed everyone to the meeting. Attendance was down due to snow but JAD thanked those who had managed to make it. He also registered thanks to the staff at Highfield Community Centre for allowing sportKeighley to use the excellent facilities.

2. Summary of the last meeting

- Most people had received notes from the last meeting in January. Copies are available on request or via the sportKeighley website www.sportkeighley.com.

3. Information

3.1 sportKommunity

- JAD reported on recent discussions with Alan Budge of Bradford Vision. Alan is particularly involved in Keighley with the establishment of Neighbourhood Action Plans in Stockbridge, Branshaw/Fell Lane, Braithwaite/Guardhouse, Hainworth/Parkwood and Eastwood. There are many opportunities to co-ordinate some of the *sportK* partner programmes with these and there has since been a successful launch of the initiative (21st March 2005) and contacts made with community representatives.
- Considerable progress is also being made with the Oakworth Urban Village Project and this will also directly involve the *sportK* network, particularly with regard to the development of uses for Bronte School.
- Jeff Bennett had sent apologies but highlighted the ongoing Young People's Forum in Keighley. The next meeting of this is on Friday 8th April, 10am at the Keighley disabled Centre in Temple Row.
- Zuby Hamard mentioned the role of Pav Singh who is employed by CBMDC Sport and leisure as a district-wide Community Cohesion Officer. Pav has a particular brief for the Oakworth area amongst his other priorities. Pav is based in Shipley and also leads on hockey across the district.
- Deryck Feather noted that he was pleased to announce that the situation regarding price rises at the Library Hall, which had been threatening to prevent dancing going on, has now been resolved, with particular help from Cllr Malcolm Slater.

3.2 sportsKools

- The meeting was reminded of a schools' Orienteering Event on Thursday 14th April at Cliffe Castle, 1.30 to 3.30pm. If schools wish to take part in the latter event please let Steve Bell know via sl@oakbank.org.uk. Many primary schools now have fixed orienteering courses with associated maps on their grounds. (See also Section 4.12 below re an open orienteering event in April).
- JAD reported on an initiative at Haworth Primary School to utilise orienteering courses and school playground marking to encourage lunch-time use by pupils and also out-of-school physical activity. This involves training dinner-time supervisors and linking with external providers where possible. JAD described how some of the markings will enable pupils to gain UK Athletics SHINE awards via Keighley & Craven Athletic Club. This is also linking with co-ordinated work with school nurses (see *sportKare* below). Darren Starkey was supportive of this and agreed to send examples of line markings and costings to JAD.
- Tim Garthwaite described how Holy Family School is developing the use of Teaching Assistants for this sort of lunchtime activity.
- Helen Plimmer reported that in line with the development of cycling and the Keighley "CyKle" Initiative at Oakbank a constructive meeting had been held on 28th February at which it was agreed to develop a Community Go-Ride Club and to start work on infrastructure and activities development. This will also gain a kick-start from the planned event at *sportK*arnival in June (see below).
- Helen reported that Oakbank now has a full-time groundsman and that he may be available to help with line marking at feeder primaries.
- Chris Buckley from Oakbank spoke of her role on the national Multi-Skills Steering Group. The Multi-Skills Programme is a DfES-funded talent development programme (see www.talentmatters.org for further details). Keighley is ahead of the game on this project, and multi-skills clubs are already in operation led by Anthony Gill and Richard Taylor. The programme in Keighley will soon be the subject of an article in the Times educational supplement, and the Oakbank work on this is a pilot for the Bradford District in general. Further details are available from Chris on 01535 210111.
- The meeting was reminded that at the last meeting Kay Lindley had emphasised that as an extended school facilities at Victoria School are available to clubs and community groups and she is keen that they are used. Kay can be contacted on 01535 210110.
- Tim Garthwaite reported that work on the Sports Hall at Holy Family School commenced at 12.30pm on Friday 14th January but was now delayed whilst waiting for the Gas Board to disconnect a gas main!! There is a handover date of 16th December for the Sports Hall. It was confirmed that the hall is available to help with removing barriers to activities that find difficulty in accessing "standard" facilities, and netball for example will definitely have the opportunity to use the facilities.
- JAD mentioned National Outdoor Week from 12th to 20th March 2005 and his meeting with Jim Hughes who is the newly appointed Educational Visits Adviser for Bradford Education. The provisional date of Wednesday 16th March for some sort of event to mark this year is perhaps too optimistic but that hopefully we will be geared up to mark his more effectively in 2006.

3.3 **sportKollege**

- Danny Crabtree reported that the demolition company due to start clearance in Dalton Lane for the new College building in February 2005 has gone bust so there is now a delay in the programme!
- The College Winter Sports Trip had gone extremely well, and Danny is keen to organise a *sportK* winter trip, possibly to Colorado, next year.
- JAD reported the early stages of collaboration with the College in the development of an “sKTV” initiative, with the aim of developing a 30-minute pilot programme, based on the “Trans-World Sport” format, for Keighley. More details to come.

3.4 **sportKouncil**

- Mark Gladwin, who had given an introduction to and brief summary of the recently-launched Bradford Play Strategy at the November *sportKeighley* meeting, sent his apologies but confirmed that it has been decided to carry out a “Play Audit” in the Keighley East Constituency Ward. Mark would be glad to hear from anyone interested in this project, and can be contacted on 01274 432044. The area includes the NAP areas of Parkwood and Stockbridge (see above).
- The meeting was reminded of the Bradford & Keighley Schools 5x5 Football Competition to be held at Marley between 4pm and 6.30pm from 16th – 19th May.
- JAD noted that the Bradford Physical Activity & Sports Strategy has been re-drafted and re-structured and will shortly be published. Part of the proposal is for a Bradford-wide sports forum with selected representatives from key areas of the district. More details are contained in Section 9 below.
- Zuby Hamard updated the meeting on Community Sports Coach posts (see coaching below).
- There is a Fun Run in Lister Park aimed mainly at Bradford Council employees, relatives and friends on Sunday 24th April. All proceeds will go The Ann Beatty fund, The Lord Mayor’s Charities and the British Heart Foundation. More details from Bradweb www.bradweb.bradford.gov.uk or by emailing fun-run@bradford.gov.uk.

3.5 **sportKare**

- Hannah Lindsey reported that Airedale PCT is doing a lot of work with the local authority to promote physical activity. This will culminate on **Tuesday 10th May** in a “Walk ‘05” event. There will be an event in Keighley in the morning, supported and promoted by *sportKeighley*, similar to the WalkWays launch last October, and an event at Lister Park in Bradford during the afternoon. The event involves a pedometer launch under the banner “Step Up – Pass It On” designed to encourage folk to share their pedometers and get friends and colleagues into walking too. **Please mark this in your diary.**
- The PCT physical activity database (**AK**tiveDirectory), which will form an integral part of the new *sportKeighley* web structure, is due imminently having been released on the PCT intranet. All partners are reminded to provide details of their physical activity sessions to feed into the database (Hannah’s contact details are at the end of these notes).
- Much work is going on with the school nurse network to ensure that the school nurses can deliver key activities and information, and this may include help with healthy travel as well as healthy schools and other initiatives, including the health clubs that are currently being set up in certain primary schools with NOF funding. This has now involved a meeting with Education Bradford and the new CBMDC Routes to School Officer Paul Hart. A strategy for school travel in Bradford will be published by June.
- The PCT has had an extremely constructive meeting with the FA to discuss possible co-operation for the promotion of health initiatives via football. There will certainly be a number of measures arising out of this and details will be given at the next *sportK* meeting.
- JAD has been co-ordinating additional events at which the physical activity/sport/health message can be highlighted. One such is via the Cancer Research UK “Race for Life” Events, a series of 5K runs for women all across the country. This year there is an event in Skipton in May and two runs on Sunday **June 5th** at Lister Park in Bradford. Bradford athletic clubs, including Keighley & Craven AC, are already talking to the organisers about promoting continued involvement of participants in walking, jogging and running and possibly a kid’s fun mile on the day. There is also scope for the promotion of health messages via displays and finishers’ “goodie bags”. The day is also World Environment Day, and the Bradford environment partnership is also looking at some sort of promotion to link in with this. Another date for your diary, running if female, supporting if male!!

3.6 **sportKlubs**

- Keighley Wildcats Basketball Team is recruiting and developing. Details have been circulated and will be put on the *sportK* website.
- Keighley Cougars had an extremely successful visit from the Sports Minister Richard Caborn at Cougar Park on 21st February. Mr Caborn was extremely supportive of the Cougar's community links programme, headed up by Matt Foster.
- Discussions have been ongoing with Matt Foster of Keighley Cougars and Bob Gillard of Keighley Cougar Cubs with a view to their use of facilities and also shared training with Keighley & Craven Athletic Club for certain aspects of activity. Some of the rugby players are now using the track on selected and Tuesday and Thursday evenings.
- Keighley & Craven AC and other key partners are still involved with the bid to UK Athletics for a refurbishment of the athletics track at Greenhead. Once again, many thanks to all partners for their valuable input into this project.
- JAD is in touch with Tim Frear of Bronte Wanderers FC who is keen to establish the club once more at Haworth, and is proposing private investment to upgrade the grass pitch near the school and the Community Centre. JAD is co-ordinating with Haworth Primary School and the local authority in order to help with this process.
- JAD has been invited by West Yorkshire Sport to make a presentation on *sportKeighley* to representatives of other local authorities and Sport England.
- JAD has also been invited as a representative of athletics and K&CAC to meet an assessor as part of West Yorkshire Sport's Quest Accreditation bid.
- Progress continues to be made in the opening of Greenhead School and the associated City Learning Centre for wider club and community use. The aim is to guarantee opening of the community wing of the school via the City Learning Centre and by increasing the number of activities reduce the unit rate for usage to make the facilities much more affordable. Keighley & Craven Athletic Club has been leading on this, with tremendous help from Tricia McCarthy and David Copeland at Greenhead, Bradford Council Sport & Leisure and Malcolm Longsdon at Bradford Education. Jayne Rawnsley is employed at the CLC and she will be involved with reception facilities and also IT training if required. The CLC can be contacted on 01535 210500 or at info@clcgreenhead.net.

3.7 **sportKorporate**

- The Airedale Masterplan is due for imminent release and will involve many significant proposals for the development of sport and physical activity in Keighley. More details at the next meeting.
- Keighley & District Regeneration Alliance (KADRA) is still moving forward with the proposed mapping exercise of Keighley's facilities and activities, which will include sporting facilities. This is being tied together with programmes from the Town Council and Bradford Vision and the Airedale Masterplan.

4. **Facilities Development**

- The investment in facilities in the Keighley District is currently quite extraordinary. The following schemes represent multi-million pound projects to which should be added the recent £1M refurbishment of Marley, the opening of the Highfield Community Centre and Multi-Activity Community Areas (MACAs) at Steeton, Silsden and Holycroft. It is intended that all facilities are entered into the developing Sport England "Active Places" database (www.activeplaces.com) and this will form a key link on the facilities page on the updated *sportKeighley* website (update due soon).
- Will Smith of Sport Camps had referred at the January *sportK* meeting to the response to a letter to the Sports Minister Richard Caborn, discussing the difficulties that can arise in accessing school properties out of school hours, dependant often on the goodwill of caretaking staff which is not always forthcoming. Mr Caborn had pointed to a number of websites that might provide funding to pay for non-caretaking staff in certain instances, and his response was very supportive of pushing this aspect to ensure that facilities are available to the community.
- Key *sportKeighley* partners are examining the establishment of a trust that can help with the management of such facilities. This would be known as "Kafe": Keighley Active Facilities Executive and would aim to help get all facilities open and available to as wide a range of users as possible.

4.1 Holy Family School

- Work has started on the new Sports Hall, subject to British Gas, as stated above. The new signboard will soon be up.

4.2 Parkside School, Cullingworth

- The new development will include extensive arts and sports facilities which will be accessible by the community. There may be particular opportunities for the development of netball and hockey at the site among other activities.

4.3 Utley

- Danny Crabtree reported that discussions are continuing between rugby league and rugby union and the College at the Utley site in order to ensure maximum usage of facilities.

4.4 Keighley College

- Progress reported under *sportKollege* above.

4.5 Greenhead

- JAD reported on further meetings held between key partners associated with the development of Greenhead. The school, Keighley & Craven Athletic Club, UK Athletics, Bradford Education Client Team and others, including Keighley Cougars, the Cougar Cubs and Braithwaite School are pulling together a development plan that will hopefully result in the shared vision of a generic physical fitness development centre involving athletics and gymnastics amongst other activities.
- There are also plans for a full range of activities and facilities for the disabled to be integrated as part of the redevelopment of Greenhead School and also the Keighley Special Schools on the site. The target is to have a new school on the site by September 2007.

4.6 Bronte School Site

- JAD reported that there is much activity associated with the Oakworth Urban Village Scheme and the SKate initiative to increase the range of activities at Bronte in the near future. Mary Beanland of Prime Movers and Will Smith of Sport Camps, as well as Cllr Allan Rhodes and Jeff Bennett are all assisting in this.

4.7 Keighley Leisure Centre

- Plans to redevelop part of the Leisure Centre including the moving of the Tone Zone to the upper level near to the café are moving forward.

4.8 Guardhouse Primary School MACA

- Darren Starkey reported that poor weather has caused a slight delay to this project but that the new Multi Activity Community Area (MACA) should be completed after Easter.

4.9 Holycroft Primary School MACA

- Darren Starkey reported via email that this should start on site soon and be complete in the summer.

4.10 Hothfield Primary School MACA

- Darren Starkey reported via email that this should start on site in spring when ground conditions and weather improve.

4.11 Oakbank

- It is now intended that an early start will be made on converting the south-east corner of the site into a cycling facility. It is aimed to get something done in time for *sportKarnival* on 19th June (see below).

4.12 Parkwood Orienteering Course

- Darren Starkey reported that the fixed orienteering course in Parkwood will soon be ready. There is an open launch event on Saturday 16th April between 10am and 1pm. Contact Darren Ongley on 01274 435497 for details. All welcome.

4.13 Outdoor Centres

- Darren Starkey reported on NOF-funded outdoor facilities, including Ingleborough Disabled Classroom and Outdoor Classroom; Buckden Rope Courses and improved changing (ready in summer); and Nell Bank Amphitheatre and Changing Block. All centres will have an increase in capacity. There will soon be an outdoor strategy, a website and a brochure of available facilities.

5. Transport Infrastructure

5.1 Ki (Keighley Integrated)

- JAD showed the meeting the various designs for the range of initiatives under the Ki banner, which has been developed under the auspices of Airedale PCT and many sportK partners with the help of funding from the Bradford environment Partnership. Details of each initiative are contained in the sections below and will soon be available on the *sportK* website. The Ki proposals have been submitted to the Local Transport Plan, the Airedale Masterplan and have been taken up by Sustrans for their planning in the area.

5.2 Walkways

- Progress is being made in arranging to get the five Walkways routes marked out.
- There will be a Spring event of a similar nature to the launch event held in October– this will form part of Walk '05 mentioned above.
- Progress is being made on tying the system into the Routes to School initiative.
- A separate section for Walkways on the *sportKeighley* website is soon to be set up.
- Partners are encouraged to use the routes and feedback on the state of them and any issues that need addressing.
- There have been initial discussions with Keighley College with a view to using construction students to effect minor footpath repairs as part of their vocational courses.

5.3 CyKle

- A draft plan of proposed cycle routes across Keighley has been produced and a diverse audience has already committed to attending. This has initially focused on creating routes across the town and also linking schools with the National Cycle Network (Leeds-Liverpool Canal) and creating routes for children to cycle to school.
- It is intended that this year's *sportK*arnival will take the form of a Festival of Cycling to coincide with national Cycling Week in June (see below).

5.4 AKtiveHoppa

- JAD reported that he had been contacted by West Yorkshire Metro with a view to the use of Yellow Buses outside of core school times. He and Darren deSouza had met with Metro just before Christmas. The meeting had been most constructive, although there are issues to be ironed out (eg, use of buses by adults) that are important for the proposed service to be of effective use, but there is almost certainly the possibility of getting something going soon.
- A separate section for AKtiveHoppa on the *sportKeighley* website is soon to be set up.

5.5 West Yorkshire Metro Route Planner

- Attention was again drawn to the excellent and newly-revised Journey Planner via www.wymetro.com.
- Select "Journey Planner" and you will be connected to the Yorkshire Traveline site. Select "Journey Planner" again, enter your starting point (eg, postcode) in the "From" section and your destination in the "To" section. Not only will you get bus and/or train times and numbers but also maps of the nearest bus stop and the time to set off walking to the stop/station!! Furthermore, all required walking distances are given in metres!!
- It is intended that this site will form a key link on the Access page of the *sportKeighley* website.

5.6 SKate

- Work is ongoing to create an indoor facility, hopefully initially at Bronte School. There is also a developing network of outdoor facilities across the district.

- There will be a joint SKate theme at *sportK*arnival on 19th June.

6. Activities

- Most details of activities reported at the meeting are contained in the relevant sections elsewhere in these notes.
- As mentioned in section 3.5 above the Airedale PCT Activities Database is ready to receive details of activities going on in the district. Please make a note of all activities and email to Rachael.Wood@bradford.nhs.uk.
- This link will form a key link on the revamped *sportKeighley* website, and it is important for it to be of use that people update Rachael on any changes or new activities.

7. Coaching

- There is an extensive amount of coaching going on at local clubs and schools on a voluntary basis and under the NOF Out of School Hours Programme. The new “Step into Sport” programme will also increase opportunities for coaches.
- In order to rationalise and co-ordinate delivery of coaching and leadership across the area, a group of physical activity deliverers has been formed: Keighley & Airedale Physical Activity Deliverers (KEAPAD). This group met for the first time at Keighley College on 2nd March when Will Smith of Sport Camps gave a presentation on the new database for coaches in Keighley and there was detailed discussion on CRB checking and activity insurance. Attendees included Danny Crabtree (Keighley College), Hannah Lindsay and Helen Willetts (Airedale PCT), Lee Holmes (WY Police), Steve Bell (Oakbank), Richard Taylor (Keighley Community Coach) and John Dennis. This will prove to be an extremely useful forum and it is planned to have meetings in between full *sportK* meetings. All are welcome and should contact Hannah Lindsey for more details.
- The following notes are repeated from the last meeting and updates will be available at the next *sportK* meeting in May.
- The Keighley Community Coach, Richard Taylor (absent from the meeting because he was coaching!!) is visiting all of the schools in the area and continuing to deliver coaching to many groups. The post has been a tremendous success and is a credit to Richard and the various funders who have helped to make it possible. Sport Camps, Bradford Council and West Riding County FA have confirmed ongoing funding.
- There are a number of new Community Coach posts on the way in Bradford under Phase 2 of the Community Coach Scheme, as follows:
 - Basketball (Full-time, District-wide);
 - Cricket (Full-time, District-wide);
 - Rugby (Full-time, District-wide);
 - FUNdamentals (Part-time, District-wide);
 - Netball (Part-time, District-wide);
 - Hockey (Part-time, District-wide);
 - Outdoors (Part-time, District-wide);
 - Rowing (Part-time, Beckfoot);
 - Rugby Union (Part-time, District-wide);
 - Gymnastics (Full-time, District-wide);
 - Gymnastics (Part-time, District-wide);
 - Hockey (Part-time, District-wide);
 - Athletics (Part-time, District-wide).
- Further bids from Bradford have gone in to West Yorkshire Sport for Phase 3 Community Coaches. These are being funded from NOF revenue monies associated with new-build facilities across SSC clusters, thus the posts are based at the following schools:

- Multi-Sport (Full-time: Beckfoot);
 - Gymnastics (Full-time: Thornton);
 - Racquet Sports (Part-time: Hanson)
 - Athletics (Part-time: Hanson);
 - Cycling (Part-time: Thornton).
- Although Keighley was not prioritised in Bradford for the over-subscribed Phase 3 of the scheme (partly because we already have a highly successful CSC in the form of Richard Taylor), a number of posts were put forward from Keighley "in reserve" should additional funds become available. These include a full time multi-skills post (part-funded by Oakbank and Sport Camps), a full-time rugby post (part-funded by Keighley Cougars) and a part-time cycling post (part-funded by Airedale Primary Care Trust). If the central funds don't become available, due to the excellent networks and funders already in the district, it is likely that between us we can fund some of these posts ourselves anyway.
 - Coaching opportunities in the form of Community Coach jobs and coach training courses in the district and in West Yorkshire in general are co-ordinated by Bryan Brooks at west Yorkshire Sports. 8. Keighley Festival / **sportK**arnival 2005

- It was confirmed that this year's Keighley festival will run concurrently with the Bradford Festival from Saturday 18th June to Sunday 3rd July.
- The *sportK*arnival event will take place at Oakbank on **Sunday 19th June** with the emphasis on the CyKle and SKate initiatives, with all types of cycling and extreme sports being available for participation, demonstration and competition. There may also be a "Race the Train" event as there is also an enthusiasts weekend on the Keighley & Worth Valley Railway, as well as the traditional Vintage Vehicle Rally at Marley.

9. Bradford Physical Activity & Sports Forum – Keighley Input

- As has been described in previous *sportK* notes, the publication of the Bradford Physical Activity and Sports Strategy is imminent.
- A key part of the strategy is to create a district-wide forum for physical activity and sport to ensure that the wide range of partnerships identified in the strategy are developed and maintained. This proposal is a real plus for Bradford and should help to ensure that we support each other across the district and develop an "as well as" rather than an "instead of" mentality.
- Zuby Hamard has been tasked with identifying independent representatives from networks in the five Bradford areas within the district. A representative from the Keighley/Bingley/Ilkley area is required and Zuby discussed the idea that *sportKeighley* might adapt to incorporate these other areas or that a new structure might be developed to represent all three.
- These thoughts resulted in some vigorous debate at the meeting, with the general sentiment being that although *sportK* would by no means wish to be seen as a "closed shop" to other areas, it derives its strength from having a local identity and brand. It would appear to be better to find out what networks exist in Bingley and Ilkley and to help to develop those identities and brands so that they can work with *sportK*. A joint representative from all areas can then attend the District-wide network. Feedback on this issue from all partners is most welcome.

10. Any Other Business
